

Believing in **rigid rules of masculinity** is **20x more likely** to predict committing **violence** than other demographic factors like ethnicity, age, or income



**Men commit the majority** of all **violence and sexual harassment**

in Aotearoa New Zealand

In 2020, 98% of sexual violent crime proceedings were against men (police data)

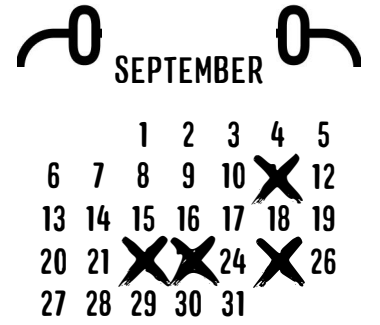


On average, **9 women** are killed by their **partner or ex-partner** every year



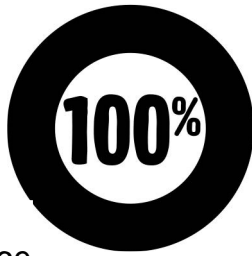
**Violence towards women** increased after the **COVID19 lockdown**

The Sunday after the first lockdown showing highest single spike in family violence incidences reported to Police for the last 3 years



**4 women** were killed by men in a single fortnight

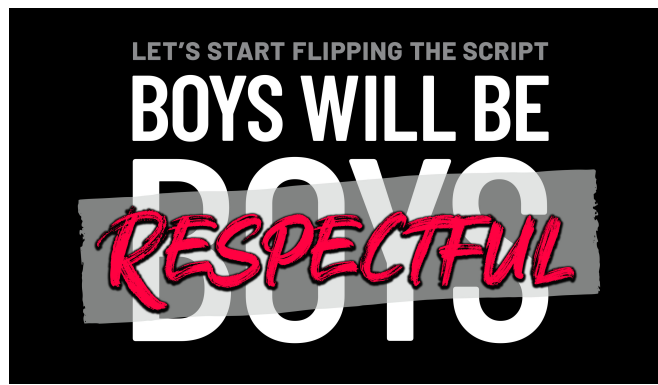
Following the August 18<sup>th</sup> lockdown



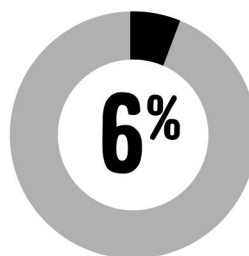
In 2020

**women** made up **92%** of those assaulted by an ex-partner

and **100%** of those sexually assaulted by an ex-partner



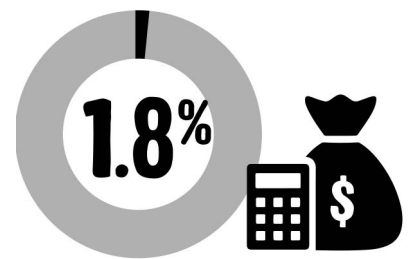
At least **1 in 5** females (and 1 in 19 males) have experienced forced or attempts at **forced intercourse** in their lifetime



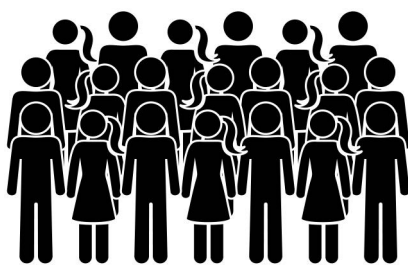
Only **6%** of sexual assaults are reported to Police  
94% go unreported



The rate of successful **rape convictions** in 2020 was the **lowest** in 10 years



Only **1.8%** of the **government's** family violence budget is spent on prevention



A 2021 Survey at Christchurch Girls' High School found **over 1/2** of the girls had been **sexually harassed**, and at least **20** had been raped



In Aotearoa, **young women aged 15-19** and young men of that same age group make up the **largest group** of those sexually assaulted and those carrying out sexual assaults respectively
